

16-19 Bursary Fund Information and Guidance 2021-22

The 16-19 Bursary Fund is allocated to schools, aimed at students who would be unable to stay in education without financial help for things like transport, meals, books and equipment.

Eligibility

To be eligible to receive a bursary students must be under 19 years of age on 31 August in the academic year in which they start their programme of study (at HBS this is Year 12) and must satisfy the residency criteria in the [ESFA funding regulations](#) 21-22

There are two levels of entitlement to the 16-19 Bursary Fund.

A. Guaranteed Bursary for defined vulnerable groups

Students from this group will receive a Bursary of up to £1,200 per year from the Fund. Payments will be dependent on attendance, behaviour and progress on the course if they fall into one of the following groups:

- in care
- a care leaver
- claiming Income Support or Universal Credit because they are financially supporting themselves
- receiving Disability Living Allowance or Personal Independence Payments in their own right as well as Employment and Support Allowance or Universal Credit in their own right

Evidence: The School requires original evidence from the Local Authority, external agencies, key worker/social worker or evidence of Income Support / Universal Credit/etc in your own name. There is more detail on evidence required in the ESFA guidance.

B. Discretionary Bursary

Students from this group do not have the same entitlement to the 16-19 Bursary Fund as the higher priority group, however they MAY be funded for Sixth Form Related Costs at the discretion of the School should funding permit through the Discretionary Bursary. Payments will depend on attendance, behaviour and progress on the course and students must:

- Live in a household where the total annual income is under £25,000
- Have achieved at least 95% average attendance (including punctuality) for the half-term
- Have produced work of an acceptable standard
- Have met all subject deadlines

Evidence: The School requires the original documentation showing the household income for 2018-19. This is likely to include the 3 most recent Universal Credit monthly award statements, which can then be multiplied by 4 for an estimate of income for the whole year (the take-home pay figure in addition to the amount of UC after all deductions will give a total monthly income) . Alternatively Working Tax Credit, Child Tax Credit, Income Support or Employment Support Allowance documentation, payslips from any adults at the address may be provided or further documentation as required.

Using payments from the Bursary

Payments from the 16-19 Bursary Fund are expected to cover the following:

- Travel to and from School
- Approved Field Trips/ Residential Courses/ essential Education Trips. Payment will be taken directly from your Bursary Fund in a way agreed with you.
- Books and stationery.
- Necessary course-related equipment and uniform/ specialist clothing.
- UCAS fees
- Learning Resources.

Students eligible for help from the Discretionary Bursary Fund should not expect that payments will cover all course-related expenses: there is a limited amount available to the School each year and this

will be distributed amongst students in need. The ESFA do not expect the Bursary Fund to be used to fund extra-curriculum activities unless they are essential to the course.

Application

Students applying for the Guaranteed Bursary must contact mboddy@hbschool.org.uk as soon as they start Sixth Form at HBS, or as soon as they are eligible for this bursary.

Students applying for the Discretionary Bursary must complete an application form available from the Main School Office.

The deadline for submitting applications is Thursday 23rd September 2021 but applications should be submitted as early as possible. Completed application forms should be handed in to Mr Boddy, School Business Manager in the Main School Office.

Bursary Payments

Bursary payments are made on a half termly lump sum basis by BACS payment. Full details will be given to those students in receipt of the Bursary. Whilst the amounts for each half term may vary, the estimated payment amount for each half term will be outlined to qualifying students in the Autumn Term. A small percentage of the Fund will be held back for emergency payments to students whose circumstances change mid-year causing them financial hardship.

Right of Appeal

If your application is unsuccessful there is an appeals process. You will receive a letter with guidance on how to appeal.
